
The RITE alternative vision will:

Create a balance of passive recreational activities which allow for enjoyment for all Interpret and protect the cultural landscape, indigenous and post colonisation/settlement Reimagine Arm End as a place for art experiences and sensitive artistic interventions Sensitively rehabilitate the reserve to reveal key moments in the landscape Re-establish connections to the 'wild' ecology Reclaim relationship with remote coastal and estuarine landscape Concentrate activity opportunities near track head

Minimise infrastructure by employing a restriction activity gradient: low to high [track head to Gellibrand Point] Protect and nurture the natural, cultural and picturesque qualities

Activity restriction gradient will enable:

- Concentrate activities to minimise visual impact of facilities and infrastructure
- Protection of ecological values, restrict access to the spit completely
- Allow interpretative elements at the track head to develop awareness of indigenous cultural values
- Restrict certain activities in sensitive parts of the reserve eg, accessing the spit
- Consideration of restricting dogs and bikes to the southern part of the reserve
